## Project Summary

The New Center for Active Aging will consist of a new 20,000 square foot single-story facility housing a variety of functions to benefit the community. The facilities amenities will include an Adult Day Care Center; a number of flexible activity rooms to be used for recreational activities, a computer lab, a library / reading room; a large health and wellness room for physical activities such as Yoga, Zumba, and low-impact aerobics; and a large multi-purpose room with a catering kitchen for hosting lectures, a variety of entertainment options, banquets, and other large-scale community events. A spacious entry Lobby will provide a central reception space with lounge seating and a coffee shop, offering visitors a comfortable place to gather and have a snack. The facility will provide physical and mental health services for our active aging community. The building will also house administrative offices for both the Department of Active Aging and the Department of Community Development.
